Livestock committee will meet soon- Carnation Farms is still looking like a good site for the USDA mobile slaughter project, possibly there is enough money for that location and the Enumclaw location, which would be ideal.

Roger Thorson is seeking a succession plan for his farm, there may be a new group of people coming together around him to help manage the transitions. Possibly a good, but complicated, property for the land-matching coalition to help make a plan as well.

Sound Food Uprising, event on Jan 26th: Meredith to attend to clarify if SVT would be a relevant participant there

Strategic Plan check in: Meredith and Hannah to revive the advocacy committee to help kick start that section of the plan.

Employee Handbook

Answer any questions – document sent in early January. Board recommended adding a section under complaint-handling about how employees report a complaint about the ED to the Board President. Also, address what happens if the timesheet is filled out late (is the paycheck delayed by a whole pay period? Or just until the timesheet is filled out?). Consider if we need to address FLMA language or issues as well as other already identified reasons for empoyee leave. Drugs/alcohol section: current language was recommended by 501 Commons HR reviewer. Perhaps add "at the discretion of the ED," for the social events section.

Ag Commission: Wrote a letter to NRCS offering feedback on the Pearson Eddy Project, voted not to support the land conservation initiative currently until concerns are addressed (county visioning proposal to put a bond on the 2018 ballot to raise money for land conservation), new Ag Commissioners incoming at next meeting. Land committee will meet more regularly, their job is to advise county staff on potential easement purchases, fee purchases, etc.

Farm Fish Flood: 2.0 implementation committee met first time last Friday. They will meet quarterly. SVT will participate in the implementation task force as an ag caucus member and participate in the ag strategic plan task force. Josh of KCD voted in to lead the ag caucus.

Co-op: open position for manager, big push is to market the CSA. Value added products currently on the shelf in stores short term as pilot! Braising mix and cole slaw mix.

Carnation Farms: Hannah started working for them this month.

Oxbow: Kevin will be the liason to SVT.

WID: Andrew Stout elected as commissioner last month. New projects will be vetted through FFF 2.0.

SVPA: RFP out for the chair position for the Taste of the Valley

Snohomish County Ag Advisory Board- would love to hear monthly updates

Sustainable Land Strategies group (Snoho.)- would love updates from them too, and ideas about how we might be helpful. Working on mapping the basin, planning for climate change, and balancing ag/farm needs.

Food hub in Snohomish: attempts to revive it after county investment several years ago. Proposed for McCollum Park in Everett on county land, permanent year-round farmers market, plus distributor, processor, commercial kitchen space. County would look for tenants for each role.

WID: April 16th, second Water Workshop with Kate Ryan, expert on farmed wetlands and the clean water act will be in attendance

KCD: seeking farmer input on proposed experiment on buffer effectiveness, meeting April 18th to help define the research questions, 7:30-8 pm.

Farmers' Co-op: New manager started, 2018 marketing under way.

Egg Co-op: next step is water supply installation. Hoping to soft-launch in May.

Ag Commission: briefing the county council in April on proposed changes in

communication patterns with council. Still discussing the Land Conservation Initiative response.

Carnation Farms: 3 new farmers in 2018 will start April 15th in their first year of apprenticeship, grain trial working with WSU planned this year, mostly certain they'll host the mobile MSU for Puget Sound Processing and should be ready soon to start use (14-16 animal unit capacity, planned for 2 days a week onsite). Possible to add a reefer trailer that would increase capacity. Farm store will be opening around July that will include a café and possibly a meat shop. Also recently hired new chef, Caprial Pence.

Libby: Funding available from Snohomish Conservation District for expansion of our services more comprehensively into Snohomish County. Meeting scheduled to discuss potential partnership on creating a voice for small, commercial growers and targeted program services for farmers.

Bank Signer changes: Motion made to remove Melissa Borsting and Laura Casey as signers, add Nancy Marshall and Libby Reed as signers. Unanimously approved.

Executive director transition plan and hiring plan (Executive Committee)

Interim ED and allocation of Melissa's current responsibilities to existing staff (25 min), shifting some responsibilities to Lainey and some to Jocelyn in accounting contract since Libby has only 20 hours a week in her interim ED position, compared to Melissa's 30 hours a week. Would like to keep an eye on Board Recruitment needs and budget planning for 2019.

Hiring for new Member Services Manager (10 min), starting as soon as possible Hiring timeline for new ED (10 min)

Job description to be refined by the hiring committee by mid-Sept. Starting search process in October, goal of new hire starting mid-January 2019 Hiring committee: Hannah, Erin, Petrina Beyers property – does SVT want to write a letter advocating for the County to purchase the property (**Melissa et al.**)

We have been verbally requested to submit a letter to the county, asking the county to buy the property and then allow SVT to manage part of it as a part of our farm incubator program. Discussed the intricacies of what precedent this might set, whether this would be in the interest of our membership, whether this serves the agricultural community in the long term. As an alternative, we would like to request that they clarify what they are asking of SVT in written form, and we would be glad to clarify that we continue to remain interested in managing a portion of the land onsite as a part of the EFP.

Updates from partners (WID, SVFC, KC Ag Commission, CCF, Carnation Farms – Erin, Neil, Meredith, Petrina, Hannah)

Poultry Co-op: awarded the Value-added producer grant, for general operations including some staff time. Regional Food Systems grant is moving through the process, answer anticipated in Oct., for project to create new farmer mentorship and an education component, and also a matching fund for farmers who want to establish a new flock or expand to a larger flock of min. 250 birds- aimed at recruitment of new co-op members. Egg-washing machine is working! Cooler is operational.

WID: First project is operational, counting and dredging at Remlinger in the first priority basin, looking forward to a tile replacement project at Full Circle, and lining out projects in future priority basins. Providing help in allowing farmers to access fish screens on their irrigation intake lines.

SVFC: 108 members this season, marketing goal achieved. Looking for a driver/assistant. Ag Commission: There's a farm tour in South King County for Council members and staff on July 26th. North county tour delayed for next year.

Carnation Farms: Got the USDA Rural Business Development grant, to produce 10 value-added products in their kitchen in 2019, kick-off starting in Sept. Carnation Farms will become a copacker. Farmstand turning into a small café in a road-side building over the next years. Farmers in training are in full swing, and a ton of events are ongoing. Mobile Slaughter Unit project is still on the table, but the operator previously committed has been rejected by the county- seeking new operator for the site.
